<u>Agricultural Calander – January</u>

Agricultural Operations	
1.	Placing white gauze in greenhouses to close doors and ventilation
	openings.
2.	Ventilating greenhouses in the valley by opening side vents to reduce
	humidity.
3.	Continuous weeding and monitoring weather conditions to prevent
	the spread of fungal diseases. Spraying organic copper to prevent
	fungus, and Neemagreen for insects.
4.	Weeding and nursery of cultivated potatoes with irrigation and
	fertilization, and spraying Coppera Flostyl against late blight.
5.	Pruning olive and citrus trees, winter spraying after pruning, adding
	treated organic fertilizer and slow-release fertilizer:
	Granufert 18- <u>18-5.</u>
6.	Pruning almond trees, apples and grapes, especially those that have dropped all their
	leaves, before the buds swell, and winter spraying after pruning, taking into account peeling the dry bark from the stems of grapes before the spraying process so that they
	are not a source of infection with diseases or insects and to facilitate the access of
	pesticides to them. Also, add treated organic fertilizer and the slow release fertilizer
	Granufert 18-18-5 for trees.
7.	Collecting and disposing of citrus fruits infected with the
	Mediterranean fly, and weeding the orchard.
8.	Weeding in wheat and barley fields, spraying herbicides and adding
	high-nitrogen fertilizer 40-0-0 after a week of using herbicides.
9.	Continue planting Egyptian onion seedlings in the permanent soil
	during this month.
10.	Balancing irrigation quantities with the prevailing temperature to
	avoid the appearance of mold on the roots.
