

Agricultural Calander – March

Agricultural Operations	
1.	Paying attention to the ventilation of plastic houses to reduce humidity and avoid fungal diseases, spraying Last Point, spraying and watering Calphose, fertilizing Micronate 36, and continuing scaling, pruning, spraying and picking.
2.	Follow up on Open Field vegetables, take good care of weeds & spray Abamaxam to control thrips, flies, aphids, & spray Emafel to control worms.
3.	Possibility of harvesting American onions, garlic, and potatoes, and planting eggplant, okra, cowpea, faqous, and molokhia in open cultivation in the Jordan Valley.
4.	Cultivation of summer fodder such as alfalfa, after preparing and plowing the land and adding treated organic fertilizer and slow-release fertilizer – Granulert 18-18-5.
5.	Monitoring powdery mildew disease on fruit trees, vegetables and roses. If it appears, it should be sprayed with appropriate pesticides such as Last Point. The infection with tunnel makers increases on citrus. It is recommended to spray Emafel + Neemagreen. Olives are also sprayed with summer oil and the insecticide Pyrifil + fungicide Copperal Flostyl during this month.
6.	Possibility of grafting fruit trees by eye, removing unwanted growths and cankers on the stems of trees, and coating the stems with Nebranate mixture to prevent fungal and insect infections.
7.	Irrigation of fruit trees once a week in all areas.
8.	Starting the seeding of annual ornamental plants and preparing them for marketing.
9.	The time is right for planting palm seedlings.
